Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Himalayiya Ayurved Yoga Avam Prakartik Chikitsa Sansthan, Gram-Fatehpur Tanda, Jeevanwala, Post via Doiwala, Dehradun-248140, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0242) with an intake capacity of 59 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course and extended permission with 15 seats in 03 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (ii) Panchakarma-05 seats (iii) Rachna Sharir-05 seats and Denial of permission in 01 PG Course in the subject namely (i) Kriya Sharir-05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2026-27-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Himalayiya Ayurved Yoga Avam Prakartik Chikitsa Sansthan, Gram-Fatehpur Tanda, Jeevanwala, Post via Doiwala, Dehradun-248140, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0242)** inspection was conducted on **25.05.2026 and 26.05.2026 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 20 seats in 04 PG Courses under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2026-27.
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report and the shortcomings/defects were observed and same was placed in the 170th Board meeting of MARBSIM held on 11.08.2026 and Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to your college.**
- 3) In view of above an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBSIM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 17.08.2026** was granted to your college to appear on **20.08.2026** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the permission to your college with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 20 seats in 04 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (ii) Panchakarma-05 seats (iii) Rachna Sharir-05 seats and (iv) Kriya Sharir-05 seats for the academic session 2026-27, under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied.**
- 4) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter. Ref. No. Himalayiya/2026/940 Dated 18.08.2026** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Gauri Shankar Indoria, Principal and Nishant Rai Jain, Administrative Officer of college** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **20.08.2026** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college.
- 5) Thereafter, observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms regulations, namely, "Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024, (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 the observation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **174th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 25.08.2026 and the Board verified the same and found that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-27 after applying the punitive policy in accordance of section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act, 2020 approved for the academic session 2026-27.**

❖ **As per the "Punitive Policy for the academic session 2026-27" :-**

- i) **"For Deficiency in Hospital staff (excluding group D staff) seat reduction in intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake capacity as under:-**

For non-availability of nursing staff seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 1 seat per 03 deficient staff.

As total 05 nursing staffs are not available, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat.

For PG Courses:-

- ii) **In department of Kriya Sharir** - College is having 03 eligible teaching faculty (01 Assistant professor and 01 Associate Professor for UG respectively and 01 Associate Professor for PG) and there is shortcoming of 01 Professor for UG & PG and 01 lower faculty for PG and **college is not eligible for issuance of permission in Kriya Sharir department with 05 seats as per the as per Regulation 8 (1) of MESAR PG Ayurveda, 2024.**

Accordingly, after applying the punitive policy for the academic session 2026-27 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **Yearly permission with intake capacity 59 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations, 2024 and Extended permission with 15 seats in 03 PG Courses** in the subject namely (i) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (ii) Panchakarma-05 seats (iii) Rachna Sharir-05 seats in accordance with regulation 15(5) of MESAR PG Ayurveda regulations, 2024 and **Denial of permission in 01 PG Course** in the subject namely Kriya Sharir-05 seats as per Regulation 8 (1) of MESAR PG Ayurveda regulations, 2024 for the academic session 2026-27 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

"DECISION"

- 6) Yearly Permission is hereby granted to Himalayiya Ayurved Yoga Avam Prakartik Chikitsa Sansthan, Gram-Fatehpur Tanda, Jeevanwala, Post via Doiwala, Dehradun-248140, Uttarakhand (Inst. ID-AYU0242) with 59 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations, 2024 and **extended permission with 15 seats in 03 PG Courses** in the subject namely (i) Dravyaguna Vigyana-05 seats (ii) Panchakarma-05 seats (iii) Rachna Sharir-05 seats in accordance with regulation 15(5) of MESAR PG Ayurveda regulations, 2024 and **Denial of permission in 01 PG Course** in the subject namely (i) Kriya Sharir-05 seats as per Regulation 8 (1) of MESAR PG Ayurveda regulations, 2024 for the academic session 2026-27 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020. subject to the following conditions:-
- 7) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 8) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 9) **Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.**
- 10) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2026 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2027-28 :-**
 - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- 11) The fulfilment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2027-28.
- 12) Further, in case you are not satisfied with the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM, you may prefer an appeal as per regulation 65(1) of MESAR 2024.

Note:- It is also noted that, if the concerned University does not grant affiliation to the college or withdraws the affiliation, the permission granted by MARBISM shall automatically stand withdrawn without any further notice or order.
